Topic: Broadcasting Burlais

Main areas of study:	<p>The over-arching theme for this topic will be pupil-led enterprise based learning as we enter the Swansea Enterprise Project.</p> <p><b>In Languages, Literacy, and Communication - English</b> - <i>Persuasion text type, letter writing, grammar, poetry, instruction text type, and Spanish with Pentrehafod.</i></p> <p><b>In Languages, Literacy, and Communication - Welsh</b> - Past tense writing, role play, speaking and listening and <i>third person</i> sentence patterns.</p> <p><b>In Maths &amp; Numeracy</b> - Money and profit and loss; perimeter, area and volume (geometry); decimals and percentages; temperature and negative numbers; ratio; applied numeracy skills across the curriculum through our topic and theme.</p>
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	<p><b>In Humanities</b> - Welsh and global economies, governance of Wales and the wider world, poverty and inequality, the history of broadcasting including TV, radio, and digital media.</p> <p><b>In Science and Technology</b> - chemistry, design and technology and product design.</p> <p><b>In Expressive Arts</b> - digital media, printing, drama, and advertising.</p> <p><b>In Health &amp; Well-being</b> - mental health, athletics and summer sports.</p> <p>Cross-curricular skills - Cross-curricular numeracy skills used in money, profit and loss, sales, and budgeting. Cross-curricular literacy skills used in persuasion through oracy and advertising. Digital skills used to promote and publish adverts.</p>
